Baltimore Climate Action! On December 27, 2023, a broad coalition of Maryland peace activists, including Veterans For Peace, again "crashed" the Military Bowl parade before the yearly football game of mid-level college teams held in the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium, Annapolis. This bowl game originated in 2008, and in 2010 military-industrial complex giant Northrop Grumman signed on as the title sponsor, partnering with the USO. This year we brought CODEPINK's inflated

elephant-in-the-room along to represent militarism's effect on climate. (It was used in the March to End Fossil Fuels in NYC last September.) About a dozen of us guided the elephant and carried banners and placards, including the Baltimore VFP chapter's climate and militarism banner (partly visible at right). We stepped right into the end of the parade, with brief police obstruction, similar to last year. Some parade viewers booed but many were friendly and supportive and took flyers.
