Dear [Congressman/Congresswoman's],

I am writing with deep concern regarding the escalating violence in the occupied Palestinian territories, including the West Bank and especially Gaza.

I urge you to take immediate action towards achieving a ceasefire in the ongoing conflict in Gaza. The current situation demands urgent attention and intervention to prevent further loss of innocent lives and to uphold the principles of international law that Israel has repeatedly violated.

The conflict in Gaza has escalated to alarming levels, resulting in a humanitarian crisis of catastrophic proportions. Civilians, including women and children, bear the brunt of the violence, facing indiscriminate attacks and widespread destruction of essential infrastructure. Such actions blatantly contravene fundamental principles of international humanitarian law, including but not limited to the following:

- The Fourth Geneva Convention: Israel's occupation of Palestinian territories, including Gaza, is governed by the Fourth Geneva Convention, which prohibits the targeting of civilians, collective punishment, and the destruction of civilian infrastructure. The deliberate targeting of residential buildings, schools, hospitals, and essential services constitutes grave violations of this convention.
- United Nations Security Council Resolutions: Numerous United Nations Security Council
 resolutions, including Resolution 242 and Resolution 338, call for the withdrawal of Israeli
 forces from occupied Palestinian territories and the establishment of a just and lasting
 peace in the region. Israel's continued occupation and expansion of settlements
 blatantly disregard these resolutions and perpetuate the cycle of violence and instability.
- The Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court (ICC): The Rome Statute defines war crimes as serious violations of international humanitarian law, including intentional attacks against civilians and civilian objects. The ICC has jurisdiction to investigate and prosecute individuals responsible for such crimes, regardless of their official capacity. Israel's actions in Gaza, including the targeting of residential areas and the use of disproportionate force, may constitute war crimes under the Rome Statute.
- The Universal Declaration of Human Rights: The Universal Declaration of Human Rights affirms the inherent dignity and equal rights of all human beings, regardless of nationality, ethnicity, or religion. Israel's discriminatory policies and practices, including the blockade of Gaza and the denial of basic rights and freedoms to Palestinians, violate the principles enshrined in this declaration.

Congress must take decisive action to pressure all parties to immediately cease hostilities and engage in meaningful dialogue to achieve a just and lasting peace in the region. This includes advocating for an end to military aid and support to Israel until it complies with international law and respects the rights of the Palestinian people.

As a member of the US Armed Forces, I stand firm in my commitment to upholding the values of justice, integrity, and respect for human rights. I urge you to stand with me in calling for a ceasefire in Gaza and a renewed commitment to peace, justice, and equality for all.
